	<p>SPECIAL: Terrorism & Its Connections to Drug Trafficking</p> <p>(This program is not tested and does not offer credit for certification.)</p>		60 minute video	<p>The link between drugs and potential terrorism is not a new phenomenon, and while the United States has made significant progress over the last several years to reduce the demand for and availability of illegal drugs, challenges remain both at home and abroad. Not only is the rapid increase of illegal drugs perceived as a danger, but the proceeds from the sale of drugs provides a ready source for funding other criminal activities, including terrorism. Whether a group is committing terrorist acts, trafficking drugs, or laundering money, they are all forms of organized crime.</p> <p>Governments across the globe have noted that drug piracy has become a standard part of organized international crime. They find themselves faced with classic terrorist groups that participate in, or otherwise receive funds from, drug trafficking to further their agenda. Heroin, methamphetamine and cocaine are not the only drugs targeted.</p> <p>Terrorism & Its Connections to Drug Trafficking is an hour-long broadcast that focuses on officer safety as well as understanding terrorism and the importance of communication between law enforcement agencies. Domestically, state, local, and tribal law enforcement cooperation are supported by federal initiatives such as the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) and the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDEF) programs. These efforts are supplemented by the work of the DEA's Mobile Enforcement Team and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Border Enforcement Security Task Force (BEST) programs, as well as by the work of federal agents operating out of DEA and ICE field offices across the Nation.</p> <p>This broadcast is sponsored by The Multijurisdictional Counterdrug Task Force Training (MCTFT) program. MCTFT is a federally funded partnership through the Department of Defense between the Florida National Guard and St. Petersburg College.</p>
A+	Human Trafficking	111-0709	30 minute video plus course materials	Recent estimates show that between 2 million and 4 million people worldwide are victims of human trafficking, and of those, between 18,000 and 20,000 people per year are trafficked into the United States. This course examines how the street officer can recognize the signs of human trafficking and respond appropriately.
A+	Violent Offenders Analysis, Part 3: What Makes Them Tick	179-0120	30 minute video plus course materials	To understand a violent criminal, you have to know how he or she thinks, feels, and views the world. FBI SSA Alan Brantley returns to continue violent offender analysis. In part three of a six-part series, Brantley reminds us that a criminal's view of the world is likely a lot different than ours.
A+	Weapons of Mass Destruction: What Every Officer Should Know, Part 2: Biological Weapons	162-0011	30 minute video plus course materials	This course focuses on pathogens and toxins, the two major categories of biological weapons. The course provides an overview of the weapons/agents that fall into each category, providing an orientation to the systems of infection or attack. Information is presented on known inoculations and antidotes, the types of criminal/terrorist groups likely to use biological weapons, and the conditions necessary for a successful, large-scale attack.
A+	Defining Leadership	111-0707	30 minute video plus course materials	"Leadership is all about people. It is not about organizations. It is not about plans. It is not about strategies. It is about people motivating people to get the job done." This quote by General Colin Powell describes what real leadership is all about—individual actions and interactions with others. In this course, we define leadership and the attributes, skills, and process of leadership. We also describe the core competencies necessary for an individual to be successful, which include honesty, integrity, forward thinking, competency, and inspiration.

The course also defines combat stress and describes what can happen to the human body after prolonged exposure to stress.

Learn how each can precipitate a situation of control or resistance for the officer as contact and cover principles are applied.
A+	Visual System Dominance	179-0165	30 minute video plus course materials	Eighty percent of everything you are going to perceive in life—out on the street, in your car, or in a building—is going to come through your visual sense. The visual sense is dominant, particularly during periods of high stress. It will supersede any of the other senses to give your body the information it needs to make a decision on the environment and to respond to the scenario you are experiencing. Join us to learn more.
A+	Suicide by Cop	057-4005	30 minute video plus course materials	This course looks at pre-incident indicators of potential suicide-by-cop events based on hundreds of incidents in the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. Specific tactics to use by the law enforcement officers in response to the indicators are presented. The media reaction to law enforcement when the suicide-by-cop subject used a toy or replica weapon to precipitate the incident is discussed.
A+	Post-Blast Investigation, Part 1: Introduction to Explosive Theory and Effects	162-0014	30 minute video plus course materials	This course is the first part of a series on post-blast investigation, based on the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms state and local post-blast investigation training. Part one focuses on the types and effects of the most common bomb-making materials and how to identify what was used in a crime. We discuss logistics and safety issues as related to explosion investigations.
A+	The New Paradigm: House of Horrors	179-0146	30 minute video plus course materials	Enter the house of horrors and experience some of the realities of police-involved shootings. Students report memory gap and tunnel vision and undergo a massive chemical dump that affects the way they think, feel, see, and react. It is all a part of the firearms training at the Massachusetts State Police Academy.
A+	Tactical Patrol: Aggressive Patrol and Order Maintenance Policing, Part 1	163-0011	30 minute video plus course materials	This course is the first of a two-part series on patrol strategies and tactics. Part one focuses on aggressive patrol and crackdowns as well as order maintenance policing. The purpose of this two-part series is to provide officers with an understanding of strategies that can be utilized during uncommitted time, when they are not answering calls for service or performing other activities.
